## Demeter's Wrap

(For Spring, make this beautiful wrap in variegated rayon yarn of Crunchy Grapes. Rayon just beautifully cascades on your shoulders, no curling edges too.)

Terms US

Skill Level Intermediate Hook H 5.0 mm

Yarn DK/ Light Worsted Balinese Rayon variegated yarn in Crunchy Grapes

**Gauge** 2 shell-fans in 2 rows= 4 inches

Yardage 552-600 yards

3 balls=300 grams

**Notes** The stitch is a multiple of 12, add 2 to any set of 12 you make. Your base

chain would determine the width of your project, so if you want it narrower (scarf) or wider to make a bigger wrap, you can always go chaining sets of

12.

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## Pattern:

- 1. CH 60 (72, 96,) plus 2. (Twist your work so that you will work on the back of the chains you made, this way avoids large holes) SC in 2<sup>nd</sup> CH from hook, \*\*CH5, SK 3 CH, SC in the next\*. Repeat from \*\* to \* to end.
- 2. CH 6, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp, 8 DC in the next 5CH-sp, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp.

  \*\*CH5, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp, 8 DC in next 5CH-sp\* Repeat from \*\* to \* CH2, TR in SC made in previous row (that SC you made in 2<sup>nd</sup> CH from hook), turn.
- 3. CH1, SC in same place, SK2 CH, \*\*DC-picot on 7 DC, DC in last, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp\* Repeat from \*\* to \* You end with SC on the 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of 6CH made in previous row, turn.
- 4. CH9, SK 2 picots, SC on the 3<sup>rd</sup>. CH5, SK 1 picot, SC on the next, CH5, SK 2 picots, TR in SC sp before next fan. \*\* CH5, SK 2 picots, SC on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, CH5, SK 1 picot, SC in next, CH5, SK 2 picots, TR in SC sp before next fan \* Repeat from \*\* to \* you end with TR on the SC made in beginning of previous row.
- 5. CH6, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp \*\* CH5, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp\* Repeat from \*\* to\* When you reach the 9CH; CH5, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH, CH2, SK2, TR in next, turn.
- 6. CH3, 4DC in first stitch, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp \*\*CH5, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp, 8 DC in next 5CH-sp\* Repeat 4 more times. SK 2 CH, 5DC in next, turn.
- 7. CH3, 7DC-picot on top of 7 DC, just DC on the last DC, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp \*\* 7DC-picot in next group of DCs, just DC on the last, CS in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp\* Repeat on 4 other remaining shells. 4DC-picot in last half-fan, DC on top of CH3, turn.
- 8. CH6, SK 1 picot, SC in next. \*\*CH5, SK 2 picots, SC in next, CH5, SK1 picot, SC in next, SH5, SK 2 picots, TR in SC sp before next fan. Repeat from \*\* to \* 4x. To do that half fan; CH5, SK 2 picots, SC in next, CH2, SK 1 picot, TR on top of CH 3 of previous row, turn.
- 9. CH6, SK CH2, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp. (CH5, SC in 3<sup>rd</sup> CH of next 5CH-sp) all the way down the end of row.

Repeat stitch pattern from 2-9 until you get desired length of your wrap.
