## Oemeter's שoraf

(For Spring, make this beautiful wrap in variegated rayon yarn of Crunchy Grapes. Rayon just beautifully cascades on your shoulders, no curling edges too.)

| Terms | US |

| Skill Level | Intermediate |
| Hook | H 5.0 mm |
| Yarn | DK/ Light Worsted Balinese Rayon variegated yarn in Crunchy Grapes |

| Gauge | 2 shell-fans in 2 rows= 4 inches |
| Yardage | $552-600$ yards |
|  | 3 balls=300 grams |

Notes The stitch is a multiple of 12 , add 2 to any set of 12 you make. Your base chain would determine the width of your project, so if you want it narrower (scarf) or wider to make a bigger wrap, you can always go chaining sets of 12.

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## Pattern:

1. $\mathrm{CH} 60(72,96$,$) plus 2. (Twist your work so that you will work on the back of the chains you$ made, this way avoids large holes) SC in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{CH}$ from hook, ${ }^{* *} \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SK} 3 \mathrm{CH}, \mathrm{SC}$ in the next*. Repeat from ${ }^{* *}$ to * to end.
2. $\mathrm{CH} 6, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}, 8 \mathrm{DC}$ in the next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next 5 CH -sp. ${ }^{* *} \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}$, 8 DC in next 5 CH -sp* Repeat from ** to * $\mathrm{CH} 2, \mathrm{TR}$ in SC made in previous row (that SC you made in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{CH}$ from hook), turn.
3. $\mathrm{CH} 1, \mathrm{SC}$ in same place, $\mathrm{SK} 2 \mathrm{CH},{ }^{* *}$ DC-picot on $7 \mathrm{DC}, \mathrm{DC}$ in last, SC in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next 5 CH -sp* Repeat from ${ }^{* *}$ to ${ }^{*}$ You end with SC on the $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of 6 CH made in previous row, turn.
4. CH9, SK 2 picots, SC on the $3^{\text {rd }}$. CH5, SK 1 picot, SC on the next, CH5, SK 2 picots, TR in SC sp before next fan. ${ }^{* *} \mathrm{CH} 5$, SK 2 picots, SC on the $3^{\text {rd }}, \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SK} 1$ picot, SC in next, CH5, SK 2 picots, TR in SC sp before next fan * Repeat from ** to * you end with TR on the SC made in beginning of previous row.
5. $\mathrm{CH} 6, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}{ }^{* *} \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}{ }^{*}$ Repeat from ${ }^{* *}$ to* When you reach the $9 \mathrm{CH} ; \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}, \mathrm{CH} 2, \mathrm{SK} 2$, TR in next, turn.
6. $\mathrm{CH} 3,4 \mathrm{DC}$ in first stitch, SC in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}{ }^{* *} \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next $5 \mathrm{CH}-\mathrm{sp}, 8 \mathrm{DC}$ in next 5CH-sp* Repeat 4 more times. SK $2 \mathrm{CH}, 5 \mathrm{DC}$ in next, turn.
7. CH3, 7DC-picot on top of 7 DC , just DC on the last DC, SC in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next 5 CH -sp ** 7DC-picot in next group of DCs, just DC on the last, CS in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next 5CH-sp* Repeat on 4 other remaining shells. 4DC-picot in last half-fan, DC on top of CH 3 , turn.
8. CH6, SK 1 picot, SC in next. ${ }^{* *} \mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SK} 2$ picots, SC in next, CH5, SK1 picot, SC in next, SH5, SK 2 picots, TR in SC sp before next fan. Repeat from ** to * $4 x$. To do that half fan; CH5, SK 2 picots, SC in next, CH2, SK 1 picot, TR on top of CH 3 of previous row, turn.
9. $\mathrm{CH} 6, \mathrm{SKCH} 2, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next 5 CH -sp. ( $\mathrm{CH} 5, \mathrm{SC}$ in $3^{\text {rd }} \mathrm{CH}$ of next 5 CH -sp) all the way down the end of row.

Repeat stitch pattern from 2-9 until you get desired length of your wrap.
